

Senior residents at **Somerby St. Vincent's One Nineteen** competed in the Bridge Tx:Team Senior Summer Games, a five-activity senior-only competition fashioned in the spirit of

the Paris 2024 Olympics. The concept originated with the popular Bridge Tx:Team Senior Summer Games held in July 2021 in conjunction with the Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

Prosper's Community Connectors Advisory Board is seeking members.

Motion Industries Inc. has committed to Partnership Accreditation in Indigenous Relations, a program of the Canadian Council for Indigenous Business.
